

Mesh selection guide

Every mesh and fabric across our door, window, and outdoor ranges - what each one does, and which products it is available on. About 98% of the homes we screen choose the standard insect mesh; the rest of the range covers coastal midges, pets, sun, privacy, and weather.

Mesh / fabric	What it does	Available on
Standard insect mesh	18x14 weave, ~58% open - what almost every home chooses.	Every door, window + outdoor screen
Midge & no-see-um mesh	finer 18x18 weave (~48% open) for coasts, estuaries, and bush.	Every door, window + outdoor screen
Pet mesh	PawScreen Lite vinyl-coated polyester (~45% open) - takes paws and claws.	Door screens, Executive outdoor blinds
Solar / privacy mesh	E-Screen, 10% or 6% openness - cuts heat, glare, and UV.	Wall Screen doors (80 mm), Serene windows, Executive outdoor blinds, Ziptrak outdoor blinds
Blockout fabric	Vibe range - full light exclusion for bedrooms and media rooms.	Serene windows
Clear PVC	glass-like full enclosure for weather and heat retention.	Executive outdoor blinds, Ziptrak outdoor blinds
Outdoor privacy fabrics	Vtex Extreme / Plus / Ultra / View colourways.	Executive outdoor blinds, Ziptrak outdoor blinds

Worth knowing. The Brio 612 pleated door screen uses its own pleated mesh as part of the system, so there are no mesh options to choose on that product. A blockout fabric (separate from the Serene Vibe range) can also be special-ordered on an Executive fitted indoors, behind big glass. And mesh reads differently in real light - an open insect mesh is barely there, a tight solar weave looks more solid - so we confirm your choice against physical samples at the measure-up.
